Dear Families and Friends,

Today we celebrated the End of Year Mass. During the Mass Father Hiep left us with two questions to ponder. When you consider all that has happened this year. What are you grateful for? And how will you show your gratitude? To support that notion, the students introduced Mass with the theme of being the best person you can be using the following information:

The Hebrew word for PEACE that appears in the bible over 250 times was the word "shalom."

"Shalom" does not just mean peace, as in no wars, no fighting, no arguing with your brothers and sisters, no being mean to others.

"Shalom" also means "wholeness and wellbeing."

So the PEACE that we talk about today is for ourselves, too.

We need to take care of ourselves during Advent and be the best person we can possibly be in order to be PEACEFUL people.

We need to be awake to who we are and how we treat ourselves as well as others.

If you have the chance, please reiterate this message with your children at home over the holidays.

**Positive relationships for families: why they're important - https://raisingchildren.net.au/**Strong and positive family relationships are **enjoyable for their own sake** – it just feels good to be part of a warm and loving family.

But positive family relationships are **important for many other reasons** too. They:

- help children feel secure and loved, which gives them confidence to explore their world, try new things and learn
- make it easier for your family to solve problems, resolve conflict and respect differences of opinion give children the skills they need to understand and build healthy and strong relationships.

Valuing each other is at the heart of good family relationships. Here are ways you might be able to do this:

- Take an interest in each other's lives. For example, make time to go to each other's sporting events, drama performances, art shows and so on.
- Include everyone when you're talking about the day's events. For example, 'What was the highlight for you today, Izzy?'
- Share family stories and memories. These can help children appreciate things that aren't obvious or that they've forgotten for example, Mum's sporting achievements when she was younger, or the way they helped care for their sibling as a baby.

Acknowledge each other's differences, talents and abilities, and use each other's strengths. For example, if you praise and thank your teenage child for listening to a younger sibling reading, your child will begin to see themselves as helpful and caring








Year 6: cultural experience: learning about dragon dancing and Chinese traditional dancing.




In Religious Education the Year 2s have been learning about 'Stories'. They started with sharing their own story, which then led us into learning about Jesus' story.


















# Mes Entrance By Lincoln Evans

**Fee Concessions** – Health Concession Card holders are eligible to apply for fee concessions. Please notify the office if you are a current card holder. A letter will then be sent home notifying eligible families of the procedure.

Last payment date for Tuition Levy, including Stationery is Wednesday, 5th February, 2025. Last payment date for Excursion & Capital Levy is Friday, 28th February, 2025. Fee Statements will be sent to families at end of March, June, August and October. Last payment for School Fees: Friday, 28th November, 2025.

**School Fees -** are charged to allow the school to function. They are determined by the amount of shortfall in Government funding to Catholic schools. Heating, electricity, water, telephone, cleaning, maintenance, insurances and council rates are very costly and so the collection of fees to meet these costs is extremely important.

#### **Uniform Reminders**



<u>JEWELLERY</u> is restricted to the following - a wrist watch, no more than **one** small matching pair of studs or sleepers in the ear lobe - gold, silver or gemstone, a religious medallion on a chain to be worn under clothing.

Fashion jewellery, make-up and nail polish are not permitted.

<u>HAIR</u> is to be kept neat and tidy at all times. Hair longer than collar length, must be **tied back completely**. This is to help restrict the spread of nits and lice and for student safety. Headband, hair ties, ribbons, scrunchies and clips must be **blue**, **black or brown**.

It is not appropriate for children to come to school with dyed or inappropriate hair styles as deemed by the Principal.





**Collecting Students from School Grounds – Child Safety** As you would understand, child safety is the number one priority for schools. As circumstances evolve, we want to ensure we have the best possible practice in place. Please note the following requirements for collecting students at the end of the day.

### Collecting from the church gate - (New arrangements)

Students in years Foundation, One and Two will remain with their class teacher at the end of the day just outside their classroom. The church gates will be open at 3.15pm, at which time parents are required to enter the school grounds to collect their children from the class teachers. This action is in place to avoid situations where students leave the school grounds and run into the church gate car park area without an adult being present.

#### **Collecting from the administration office**


Please enter the gates and collect your child from the junior classroom area or your child from years Three to Six may meet you just inside the gates. Students are not to leave the grounds and cross the car park area without an adult walking with them.

If dropping students off in the morning, you must also walk them into school. Please do not use the disabled parking bay without permission to do so.

#### Collecting from car line

Typically, St Brendan's staff are there to organize students into cars at the end of the day. If you wish to park and collect your child, please use the crosswalk and an adult must walk with their child/ren. Drop off at the beginning of the day should take place at the bus stop area.

Children who can access online learning at home as part of their education are more likely to engage in classroom activities.



#### Water safety tips from Life Saving Victoria

With many family activities happening close to waterways these school holidays now is a great time to refresh and remember what to look out for to keep the kids safe in and around water.

Play it Safe by the Water: has a great range of bite-sized snippets to remind you of what to look for and what to think about before you go to the various environments.

The Beach: There are numerous things to consider when visiting the beach. Where are the patrolled beaches, what is the weather doing, what does a rip current look like and what do you do if you find yourself caught in one?

Inland waterways: Rivers, creeks, lakes and dams are great fun but they also have hidden dangers such as currents and submerged objects. Do you know what to look for?

Rural properties: Dams, wells and tanks may not be so familiar. Have you thought about what to consider?

Home: Pools and spas at home are great fun over the summer but they are not risk free. Remain ever vigilant and always watching.

#### Supervision around water

All children require active supervision around water regardless of their swimming ability.

Beaches, pools, ponds, lakes, rivers and bathtubs all present a drowning risk. Twenty seconds is all it takes for a child to drown in as little as a few centimetres of water.

The best way to keep children safe is to keep under-fives within arm's reach, and under 10s within eyesight around water at all times. It's a good idea to make and stick to a supervision plan so there is always an adult actively supervising children around waterways during gatherings or parties, even during the winter months!

Supervise: Actively supervise children around water

Restrict: Restrict children's access to water

Teach: Teach children water safety skills

Respond: Learn how to respond in the case of an emergency
